Poor choices that I made in life led my three kids and I to become homeless in September of 2013.

I was on a destructive path and going nowhere. After losing our apartment in Portland, I came back to McMinnville (my home town) to get a fresh start. I was staying in a two bedroom apartment with my cousin and her two children. She let us stay for a month, helped us as much as she could, then we had to leave.

Within that month I signed up for Women's Recovery Court and went to two different interviews and halfway houses. I was denied at both places. I was never told why I was denied but I think it was because I had three kids. The others that I would be sharing the house with didn't have children or they had only one. I was very frustrated because the program that I was in at the time told me I wouldn't be able to stay at one of their government funded houses because I had a son who was 9 at the time, and that wasn't allowed.

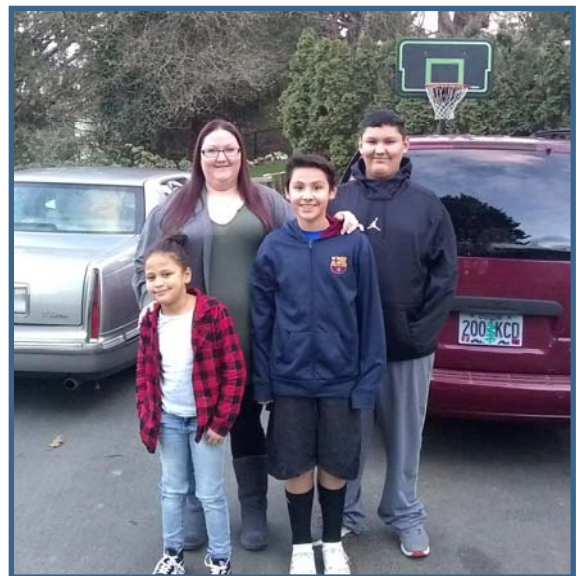
With no other friends or family to help us out, I went to Yamhill County Gospel Rescue Mission and talked to the House Manager. She was very comforting in my time of need. I remember breaking down and crying to her about how hard I was trying to make a new start for my family and nothing seemed to be working out. I wanted to give up but God had other plans.

I remember our first night there, we were scared because it was something different but we were all together under one roof. The Mission gave me the structure and support I needed to become self sufficient. I started going to Bible studies and church. I had never been big on going to church until then, It was exactly what I needed in my life.

I found the strength to not give up. We stayed through the holiday season and it was one of the best times we have had. My kids still talk about it. With the support and resources that the Mission provided, I moved out in February 2014 and we have been in our place ever since. The Mission was the foundation I needed to get my life back.

I got my G.E.D at Chemeketa Community College and I'm graduating from there with my Associates Degree this spring. I have been accepted to attend Portland State University this fall so that I can get my Bachelors degree in Social Work.

I am forever grateful that the Mission was there for us. I currently volunteer at MacHub as a way to pay back what was so freely given to me. It just goes to show that anything's possible through God.



If you'd like to help with our monthly supply program. We have a list of items that we go through on a regular basis in which many churches in Yamhill County have helped with. With the extra item donations, we are able to cut a lot of costs in our budget. Examples are garbage bags (13 & 33 Gal), Bacterial wipes/spray, snack foods, shaving razors, cough drops and allergy medications.

Phase 1



- Property next to the Mission bought and paid for.
- Immediate Need Overnight Shelter moved from School District 40 onto the property.
- Remodeled by Sherry Lewis through her company.
- Completed and began operating November 2016.
- Occupancy: 35 individuals overnight.

Phase 2



- Men's Facility has been funded. Construction by Harold Washington (Washington Roofing). Began April 2018.
- Estimate time of completion: Fall 2018.
- Resource room for Job's programs & training.
- Occupancy: Approved for 13 individuals 24/7. Can house 17.

Phase 3



- Remodel of Current building to become the Women & Children's Facility after the Phase 2 completion.
- Raising funds to: Pay off mortgage, remodel the building by enlarging the commercial kitchen, adding a children's room, constructing a playground & courtyard, and finishing with the landscaping.
- Occupancy: 17 individuals 24/7.

This expansion is an amazing thing that God has been doing!

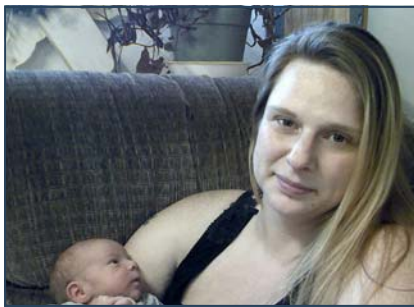
A BRICK WITH A MISSION

Our Capacity is expanding to house more homeless men, women, and children.

We are raising campaign funds for the expansion of the Mission from 17 to 70 beds. Phase 1 of the Campaign is complete (adding an overnight stay shelter housing 35 individuals). Phase 2 has begun and will add a Men's 30 day stay facility which will house up to 13 individuals. The final phase will pay off the existing debt on our current facility and will be utilized for women and children. A Children's room with nursery has been a large priority as well as a larger commercial kitchen. This brick campaign will help us raise the needed \$500,000 for the last phase and allow you to show your support with your name, logo, or clipart that you chose and a chance be part of something special!
